## WHAT IS VADS?

Mizzou undergraduate students of all majors are encouraged to apply with their expressive art, applied design and creative visual work to be presented at the Visual Art and Design Showcase (VADS). Students who are selected will discuss their work with guest jury members, gain experience in showcasing their work at the Columbia Art League and RagTag Cinema, and compete for professional development funds and other awards. *Mentorship from an MU faculty member is a requirement for all submitted works.*

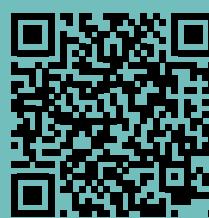

## WHAT DOES "FACULTY MENTORED PROJECT" MEAN?

A faculty mentored project means the student has sought advice or received consultation on the project from an Mizzou faculty member. Your course instructor can serve as a mentor for a project conducted for a course. For projects completed outside of a course, you should consult with an MU faculty member in the appropriate discipline to get advice and feedback.

- Students may apply on their own. Your mentor does not need to nominate you.
- Make sure that your mentor knows that you are listing them as your mentor on your application.

### How should my mentor help with the application process?

- Assist with drafting or revising the written Project Description or Artist Statement. These will be used for selection into the Showcase, shared with guest jury members, and made available to the public.
- Provide feedback for the student on the project title.
- Assist in selecting images to submit with the application.

## CATEGORIES:

### WHAT DO I NEED TO APPLY?

- Completed visual art or design project
- Online application
- Up to four high quality representative images of your work
- Title of your work
- Artist Statement
- Information on the nature and size of your project
- If the project is a video, a link to view the video must be less than 10 minutes.
